School Service in Support of our Muslim Community

On Monday, our whole school stood in silence, and in solidarity to pray for the victims of the Christchurch massacre. Members of staff prayed in different languages for the souls of the deceased, support for the aggrieved families affected and those in our Muslim community. It was an opportunity to speak to our students about what we say and do at our school and to emphasise:

- i. Care for each other.
- Whanaungatanga, manaakitanga and awhinatanga.
- iii. Love and peace.
- iv. Forgiveness and putting things right.
- v. Our school: a safe school for all.

Visits to Al-Madinah School and Zayed College

Our Head Girl, Deputy Head Girl, Head Boy and Deputy Head Boy joined me as I visited Al-Madinah School yesterday. We took flowers and cards from our students. Mr Lemanu and four boy school leaders joined a public assembly this morning. Mrs Tuaopepe and four girl school leaders will attend a memorial service next Tuesday at Zayed College.

I was sad to see a police car at Al-Madinah School when we went yesterday. A school in our neighbourhood under police guard! This is NOT right and not the country we would like for our children. The darkness must not prevail. The principal, Mr Ali, and staff appreciated our message of love and support.

Our student leaders, Ezra, Alakipomana, Kisione and Ranandi spoke well and made me enormously proud. You would have been proud to hear them too.

School Wide Goals: IDENTITY






