We encourage everyone 12 years and over to come for your vaccination together. We can vaccinate 4 people per car in the drive-through. If you would prefer to book a specific time to be vaccinated at one of our other sites, go to bookmyvaccine.nz or call the Vaccination Helpline, 0800 28 29 26 2. A free 0800 phone number is available for Pacific people to call to get help making a free COVID-19 vaccination booking for the whole household. 0800 21 12 21 is for Pacific peoples aged 12 and over and focuses on booking Pacific people and their household bubble. It operates 7 days from 8am to 8pm. 0800 21 12 21 is answered by Pacific staff and offers language services in Samoan, Tongan, i-Kiribati and Cook Island languages and is looking to increase this to include other Pacific languages. Whether your visa is current or expired, you are eligible to get vaccinated as long as you are 12 years old and over. There are systems in place to help support those we cannot find in the system, without any concerns for their visa status. 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BOT News Vaccination Expectations

The decision regarding vaccination was most difficult for the board. After considering many factors that can impact on the decision. The board in the end decided on what is best for our students, staff and the community. It was also important that the decision enables the realisation of one of our school goals that Sutton Park School is safe for all.

The Board of Trustees decided that adults and young people twelve and over need to have both vaccinations to be allowed access to Sutton Park School.

The board will make every attempt possible to make sure that vaccination can be easily accessed. There will also be support and information provided for staff, parents and youths who may need time to make a decision suitable for them individually. The Board also rely heavily in our community doing what is right for our students, staff and community.
