We encourage everyone 12 years and over to come for your vaccination together. We can vaccinate 4 people per car in the drive-through. If you would prefer to book a specific time to be vaccinated at one of our other sites, go to <u>bookmyvaccine.nz</u> or call and use the essential worker code BHTGZO9711 when prompted or call the Vaccination Helpline, 0800 28 29 26 and someone will help you find a location and time that suits you. Samoa Tutu Fa'atasi Vaccination Drive Through. Friday 1 October to Sunday 3 October. 9:00am to 6:00pm. There is no appointment needed. 		A free 0800 phone number is available for Pacific people to call to get help making a free COVID-19 vaccination booking for the whole household. 0800 21 12 21 is for Pacific peoples aged 12 and over and focuses on booking Pacific people and their household bubble. It operates 7 days from 8am to 8pm. 0800 21 12 21 is answered by Pacific staff and offers language services in Samoan, Tongan, i-Kiribati and Cook Island languages and is looking to increase this to include other Pacific languages. Whether your visa is current or expired, you are eligible to get vaccinated as long as you are 12 years old and over. There are systems in place to help support those we cannot find in the system, without any concerns for their visa status.	



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
