1. Mrs Taufalele, with two teachers from Sia Ua and Mrs Ne'emia, with two teachers from Masina Va'aia, joined many teachers from bilingual units of other schools to learn more on how to best make students truly bilingual. This project is for the whole year and continues in to next year.

2. Mrs Tuaopepe and Whaea Molly were with many teachers from other schools in Mangere, to learn more about the local history from a Maori perspective. This was at Makaurau Marae.

3. I am in Hokianga for three days with principals from Auckland, Wellington and the South Island for professional conversations on school leadership best suited for Pacific Island students. This included a visit to Te Tiriti o Waitangi grounds. A real privilege to learn more about Te Tiriti o Waitangi and how to best honour it in education.

Masina Va'aia Parents' Meeting

It was great to see so many parents at this meeting and the conversation was very productive. It was a good opportunity to revisit our bilingual programme, sharing options we can collectively put in to place.
