Protection from Covid19 and other viruses

The Board of Trustees at its meeting last night decided in favour of retaining our Orange Setting until the BOT meets next. The most important of these protocols are:

- ii. Staff and students twelve and over are to be fully vaccinated.
- iii. Visitors to the school including parents are to be fully vaccinated.
- iv. Visitors to the school, including parents are to report to the office.
