#### Permanent anti-slip deck surfacing

We didn't get good weather while working in winter, so we need to come back now to apply the permanent deck coating. The bridge will close temporarily so we can get this work done.

#### Bridge closed from:

#### 10am Monday 28 November to 7pm on Friday 9 December (weather dependent)

We'll be working as quickly as we can. If we get the work done sooner, we will open the bridge before this date.

During this time, you will be able to cross the Manukau Harbour via the SH2O underpass and security guards will be on duty.
