Term 1 School Attendance - Well Done Sutton Park

The report from the Ministry of Education on students attendance last term shows that:

- i. Our Term 1 attendance in 2023, was significantly higher than Term 4, 2022.
- ii. We had far more students with full attendance last term than the final term 2022.
- iii. Our Year 4 and Year 8 had by a small margin, the best attendance of all age levels.
- Our girls attendance was better than boys.
 Our average attendance across the school for
 Term 1, was much higher than the national average.

Incentivising Attendance in Term 2

- i. Every week, the top class in each syndicate will continue to be awarded a trophy.
- ii. The two classes in each syndicate with the highest attendance will have a day at Live Wire Centre on the North Shore. This will be in Week 5 and Week 10.
- iii. Teachers of students with poor attendance will contact parents to design and agree on a plan to get the student/s to school.
- iv. The Awhina Group will continue to support families needing support to get students to school.
