This programme allows parents to have a better understanding of schooling in New Zealand, how bilingual works, understanding the New Zealand curriculum, and how to best support your child to do better. All parents have big dreams for their children and is one of the motivating factors when leaving the warm blue Pacific. A better future for our children was a motivating factor for many in my family but sadly, owing to lack of understanding of the schooling system in New Zealand, only four Samoan students out of every hundred end up with a qualification critical to a bright future in New Zealand. This is the same success rate for Tongan, Cook Islander, Fijian and all Pacific students.

The knowledge gained from this programme allows parents to better support their children's learning throughout the schooling systems. It can make a huge difference to your children's chances. There are a few sessions left for the year. If you have not started, please do that this afternoon. Parents who missed out at the start are encouraged to join and catch up the other sessions early Term 1 2024.

The graduation ceremonies for these programmes will be on Wednesday 22 November for Masina Va'aia parents, and Thursday 23 November for Sia Ua parents.
