The school board in its meeting last night approved these documents for 2024:

i. Budget

The board approved the 2024 budget in principle so that the staff and budget holders are able to use the budget in preparation for the start of the year. The board is pleased to report a healthy financial position for the end of this year.

ii. Annual Curriculum Plan

The board also approved the curriculum plan for 2024. This plan was discussed and agreed to by the senior management, syndicate and whanau leaders who met for two days on 16 and 17 November. The board is pleased to report that most of the achievement targets for 2023 were achieved and is most optimistic that the same will happen for 2024.
