Term 2 - Healthy Beginnings - Hopeful Futures

We are in Week 2 of Term 2 and we are getting straight into our theme of Healthy Beginnings for Hopeful Futures. We are encouraging all our students to start getting into the habit of thinking about healthy beginnings such as the foods that we eat. Is the food helping us in our growth development? Do we understand what we are eating and how that affects our learning at school and at home? Are the ingredients in the food we eat healthy for us? Can we start making healthy choices in the decisions we make in what we choose to eat? How do food choices impact our future? What do we need to do to change our mindsets about healthy choices? These are only a few examples of what all our children at Sutton Park School are looking at in the different learning areas. Your support and guidance at home by having a korero, a talanoa around their decisions will be most helpful and supportive in their learning.

Winter is approaching us very fast

Early mornings are getting cold and so we need to ensure that our children are coming to school nice and warm. Parents, this is your responsibility - it saddens me when I see children come to school early in the morning with no school jumper or jacket and no shoes and it is very cold. 
