## **What is Kaitiakitanga?**

In a school setting, **Kaitiakitanga** (a Māori concept often translated as guardianship or stewardship) is the practice of looking after the people, the culture, and the environment. It moves beyond simple "sustainability" and focuses on a deep sense of responsibility to protect what matters for future generations.

Our teachers are working in their teams to ensure that there are a lot of activities and new learning around the theme of Kaitiakitanga.

Our school values for this term are - Respect and Identity. These values connect very well to our theme. In the meantime, children are looking at Te Tiriti o Waitangi and why we have Waitangi Day. It is important for all of us to understand Te Tiriti o Waitangi, it is not only for our Maori whanau.

## **Attendance**

All schools in New Zealand are required to use their Attendance Management Plan. This is a big focus for the Ministry of Education this year. Dan Mailata has been appointed to carry out home visits to support families with children who are not coming to school every day. Let's work together to get **all** our students attending school 90% of the time this term, and throughout the year.

If your child is away for 3 or more days for sickness or injury, a medical certificate is required.

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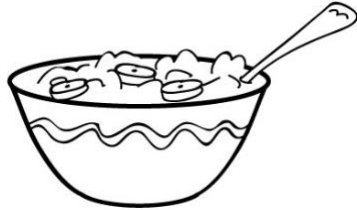
